#### Secretary's Report

Hi everyone,,

This report is simply a quick update of the Club's happenings over the Christmas period, which has been quiet from a correspondence stand point. As mentioned at the previous meeting the proposal for the changes to the Bermagui boat ramp went before the Council. I sent the BBGAC a letter of support and have been notified that the plans had been until February following consultation with impacted parties. Will seek to update further on this. The NSW GFAA website has been updated on the use of braided line and it has been decided that Canberra will follow accordingly. As such braided line can be used for Club points only (excludes Tournaments), however it is recommended that you use IGFA rated braid and check any tournament rules before fishing to confirm eligibility. Furthermore, the Club reserves the right to test the line for record claims and at its discretion. Alan proposed moving to online membership forms which hopefully can occur within the near future. Finally, the meeting closed with the annual Christmas celebrations although this year pizzas were substituted for Chinese entrees to no complaint, and as always was the most attended meeting of the year.

Yellowfin Tournament updates include the sanctioning approval from NSW going through. With that out of the way we can now focus on sponsorship and organizational duties associated with the tournament. We are planning to advertise in the next issue of Bluewater magazine to get the word out and get some exposure. I have been in discussion with a new sponsor WRI Weather Routing Inc. regarding the tournament and they have agreed to come on board and will allow competitors to access their sea surface charts and weather data free of charge. I believe this is a great addition to our tournament and should help to set it apart from others on the South Coast by providing a more inclusive experience for all involved.

The Alliance Tag and Release Competition is coming up on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> of March in Bermagui, which Canberra Game Fishing has historically been a part of. #### Vanuatu Ocean Blue Fishing- By Doug Read

After more than 12 months of deliberation Leanne and I finally made the decision to book a week of game fishing with Ocean Blue Fishing, staying at the Trees and Fishes resort in Vanuatu. Having never been to Vanuatu before, I wasn't sure what to expect but was curious to see how the country had recovered from the massive cyclone that scored a direct hit on the tiny island nation 12 months previously. On the drive from the airport to our resort we had a glimpse of the struggles faced by the local people with the "lucky" ones living in shipping containers and others in rusted out cars covered by sheets of old corrugated iron. One can only imagine what the daily life struggle would be like for these people.



We travelled to the western side of the island to the Trees and Fishes resort and moved into our well-appointed bungalow. After a beer or two we had a briefing with Andrea Traverso who heads up fishing charter operations at the resort. The resort was equipped with 3 Edgewater 32 centre consoles powered by twin 225 Yamaha's and one 17 Edgewater powered by a 115 Yammy. We had booked the couples package and the 17 was to be our platform for the next 6 days. Fishing options were essentially unlimited with GT's, Doggies, Sailfish, Wahoo, Yelllowfin, Mahi Mahi and of course Blue Marlin. Being volcanic the island water depths drop away quick from the shore, in some places 700 metres or more just 2km out. To enhance your chances a series of 6 FAD's have been installed by Ocean Blue at a cost of \$10,000 each. They are the staple location for almost all

available species and on most days they are all there in big numbers.

We started our first morning targeting GT's and after a less than enthusiastic response to my cheerful "G'day" to our skipper Stefan, (we later realised that he didn't loosen up until about 12 noon each day after the effects of the previous night's Kava binge wore off!), we headed off in the 17 with the skipper ringing the neck of the Yammy as we skipped across the water at 34kts! It didn't appear to matter too much whether the water was flat or choppy the Yammy only had 2 speeds, stalled of flat out!





After 30min of "hang time" we arrived and commenced a solid 2 hour popper casting session for GT's and eventually managed a modest 10kg model as reward. Then off to the closest FAD for some more popper action where we managed a 10kg Yellowfin and dropped a decent Wahoo. We made the call to head for the FAD's on day 2 and after a quiet start on the first FAD, moved on and found the water being ripped apart by 50kg Yellowfin. Out came the poppers and we had a double hook-up on 2 fish, mine went 38kg and Leanne's 40kg. We caught another couple to 30kg and several Mahi Mahi to about 10kg before we ran out of room to keep the fish so called it an early day.







Day 3 we went back out to the FAD's and managed a couple of moderate size Mahi Mahi before the wind pick up and the skipper made the call to head in. We were ruing a missed opportunity as one of the larger boats found a patch of Yellowfin and brought in 4 to 60kg and 2 Blue Marlin to 140kg. It should be noted that pretty much all edible fish are brought in and for use at the resort with the vast majority going to feed the local people.



Day 4 we opted to upsize to the 32ft Edgewater as our bones were starting to ache from the smaller boat. We found the Yellowfin pretty much where they were the day before with packs of the smashing up the water around a Blue Whale that we inhaling Anchovies, what a sight it was! On the first troll past 2 reels screamed off and Leanne and I were on a double! While we were on the skipper decided to join the action and scored one 10kg and another 60kg on a popper. Leanne again shaded me by a couple of kilos with another 40kg model. I made for this later with an 20kg PB Mahi Mahi and finished off the day with a hook-up on a Blue Marlin which eventually jumped off, what an awesome day it was!





We again opted for the boat upgrade for our final day and headed down to an extinct Volcano for a crack at the local Doggies. On arrival we trolled up a couple of Stripies and several Flying Fish for the tuna tubes. The downrigger was deployed and it wasn't long before we had our first strike but unfortunately the hooks pulled. After another 30 minutes the deep bait went off again and a Sailfish took to the air behind the boat. Twenty minutes later I had my first ever Sailfish beside the boat but unfortunately it had a damaged eye from the hook and the decision was made to bring it in. For the next 15 minutes we had several strikes ranging from large Wahoo to Sharks but we didn't manage to stay connected. Finally, another Sail powered up to the skip bait and we were in business again. I asked Leanne to take this one but she insisted I take it, I soon realised why. A light rod spooled with 30lb braid on a Shimano Saragosa isn't ideal for fighting a 40kg Sail after 5 solid days of having our arms stretched. The fish went nuts and at one stage I was leaning over the side of the boat, rod and reel underwater with the fish on the opposite side, tail walking 200m away.



40 minutes later we managed to get the fish to the side of the boat for a couple of happy snaps and a good release.





On summary, the fishing was probably no better that the best of days we would experience in our home waters, it's just that every day was as good as that! Options were unlimited and the hospitality at the Trees and Fishes Resort was first class. We would definitely do it again.

#### Categories

Small Fry - Capture/Tag & Release/Measure & Release Anglers under the age of 11 years at the date entry is accepted. If you turn 11 years after entering the tournament you are eligible to fish in the "Small Fry" category until the end of the tournament year i.e. 30<sup>th</sup> June

Junior - Capture/Tag & Release/Measure & Release Anglers 11 years at the date entry is accepted and under 16 years are eligible to fish in this tournament. If you are 15 at the beginning of the tournament year you may fish and be eligible for trophies until your 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.


