
The club attended the NSW AGM with results given by Alan Latima further on in the Tale Rope.

Stay safe and hopefully get some fish for August. Sanchia








#### **Broome sailfish**

In mid August Frank Tallarida and Ian Macara chased sailfish in Broome with friend Ray Gatt. In four days fishing on an 11 metre charter boat we caught six sailfish and a couple of 10kg Spanish Mackerel, plus a mackerel tuna.

Frank and Ray caught sailfish full-size by Broome standards, up to about 23 kg (or one fifth the weight of a good NSW south coast striped marlin). For me it was more failfish than sailfish – my two sailfish were still wearing nappies, lucky to be 10kg.

Highlight of the trip was a double hookup for Frank and Ray. Immediately at hookup the skipper yelled to them to back off reel drags and let their fish run free. I climbed up to his tower and saw why skipper Chris Nisbett was alarmed -- I could see eight sharks in the vicinity, the biggest about four metres.

The skipper was worried that if the sailfish were unable to use their extreme speed because of fishermen dragging hard on the line, the sharks would have nailed them.

Through sensible work by the men on rods and a bit of good luck, both sailfish were landed in fair health and uneaten by sharks.

Despite having to let his fish run almost totally free while Frank's fish was landed, Ray still had his fish on the line. He had let out all but a metre of his 400 metres of lines and it took a light touch not to lose the fish at that stage.

When the fish came to the boat it was exhausted after such a long fight. To avoid putting a tired, slow, sailfish back into the water as easy game for a shark, deckhand Ringo pulled Ray's fish onto a wet towel, covered its eyes with another wet towel to stop it panicking and thrashing about, then put a deck wash hose pumping salt water into its mouth, so that the water ran through the gills and kept the fish oxygenated.

The boat then sped off a safe distance and the sailfish was put back into the water and towed along until it regained sufficient strength to be safely released in an area with no sharks visible nearby.

Having now seen the sharks I understood why, when deckhand Ringo earlier lost a gaff into the water and had to dive in to retrieve it, he wasted no time getting back into the boat!


Overall an interesting trip but despite hard and competent work by skipper and deckhand, sailfish were hard to find. I expect the group heading to Malaysia will have a livelier sailfish tale.


